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New 2017-2018 Pennsylvania Department of Health school immunization requirements include: elementary: a 4th dose of tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis (Tdap) and a 4th dose of polio, 7th Grade: another dose of Tdap and a dose of meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV), 12th grade (or after student's 16th birthday) another dose meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV).
